Writing about soprano **Abigail Fischer** in the New York Times, Zachary Woolfe notes: With her dramatic tumble of red hair and cello-mello voice, Ms. Fischer sings with a passionate restraint that has no equal in ber generation. You didn't want ber to stop. She is joined by Susan Ellinger, a pianist praised for her "refined, poised and singular vision", who has performed as both a soloist and chamber musician in concerts at Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center's Bruno Walter Auditorium, Caramoor and Tanglewood. The program includes a selection of Brahms late piano works, amidst the luxurious expressionism of Berg's 7 early songs. A Downtown Music debut.

Original and traditional Colombian music featuring the music of composer and pianist Pablo Mayor with flutist Anna Povich de Mayor.

One of the contemporary voices of Colombia outside its borders, **Pablo Mayor** has dedicated the last eighteen years to writing, producing, and promoting Colombian music in New York City.



He has produced three CD's with his band the Folklore Urbano Orchestra and taken the band in all its formats from trio to 14-piece orchestra, to both national and international venues. Mayor's music is featured on Arturo O'Farrill's Afro-Latin lazz Orchestra

Grammy-award winning album Offense of the Drum, on arrangements recorded by Totó la Momposina, and can be heard in live and recorded theatre works with German Jaramillo's ID Studio Theatre company for whom he has been writing music for over 17 years. He plays regularly with the Puerto Rican bomba y plena establishment "Los Pleneros de la 21," and worked as former pianist and arranger for the more then 50-year old Cuban charanga band Orquesta Broadway for 15 years. His latest "El Barrio Project," takes his Colombian orchestra into the heart of Spanish Harlem (El Barrio) and other ethnic neighborhoods in New York with a multicultural production of Colombian-inspired salsa music.

Anna Povich de Mayor is a flutist, producer, and educator known for her versatile work in both the classical and popular music worlds. She performs regularly with her husband Pablo



Mayor's renowned Colombian band the Folklore Urbano Orchestra, and has recorded on three of their CD's, while managing the establishment Folklore Urbano NYC and directing its educational program Cumbia for Kids. She has done extensive

work as a chamber musician with the New York Flute Quartet and masterclasses and performances throughout Austrailia with the New York Harp Trio, Ms. Povich de Mayor has won numerous awards including a Chamber Music America grant, and was featured soloist with the Stony Brook graduate orchestra performing CPE Bach's Concerto. On the faculty at Turtle Bay Music School, she teaches flute, coaches chamber music, and co-directs their annual residency on Colombian music. She has worked with organizations including Carnegie Hall, the 92nd St Y, the American Composers Orchestra, and directed and curated concert series with the Queens Library and Le Poisson Rouge, Manhattan. Current projects include developing programming for the new arts alliance ArtsLatinoNY at their home in the South Bronx.

ESTHER AND SUN-A PARK: DUO AMADEAE

One Piano, Four-Hands Prize Winners of the New York International Piano Competition.

Sisters Esther and Sun-A Park, known as Duo Amadeae, dazzled the judges at the 2016 Chicago International Duo Piano Competition, winning this distinguished event sponsored by the Music Institute of Chicago.



Pianist **Esther Park** has performed as a soloist with orchestras and in recitals across the United States as well as Asia and major European cities. Dr. Park has appeared as soloist with the Houston Symphony, Yale Philharmonia, Corpus Christi Symphony, Filharmonia Pomorska, Poland, Orchestra Filarmonica, Romania, Shanghai Philharmonic, China, Shreveport Symphony, the Juilliard Symphony, and the New Jersey Symphony.

Recent recitals include performances at the Juilliard Theater, Alice Tully Hall, Lincoln Center, Carnegie Halls' Weill Recital Hall, Salle Cortot in Paris, the New Jersey Performing Arts Center, Palau de la Musica, Valencia, Spain and on the Dame Myra Hess Piano Recital Series, Chicago. She has appeared at the Music Academy of the West (Santa

Barbara), the Aspen Music Festival, the Bowdoin Summer Music Festival in Maine, the Tel-Hai International Music Festival in Israel, and the Van Cliburn-TCU Institute in Texas. Dr. Park has been heard in New York on WQXR Radio station as the winner of the 52nd Kosciusko International Competition and the Gina Bachauer Competition.

Pianist **Sun-A Park** is quickly establishing herself as one of the exciting pianists of her generation. Hailed as "incredible" by the great pianist Martha Argerich, Ms. Park has received international recognition in several competitions including first prize at the 2018 Olga and Serge Koussevitzky Young Artists Awards (New York), and prizes at the 5th International Sendai Music Competition (Sendai, 2013), the 58th Ferruccio Busoni International Piano Competition (Bolzano, 2011), and the Gina Bachauer International Piano Competition (Salt Lake City).

During her 2017-2018 Season, Ms. Park made appearances at Steinway Hall (New York), Bass Recital Hall (Fort Worth, TX), and was a featured soloist with the Yale Philharmonia and Sendai City Orchestra (Japan) performing the Tchaikovsky Concerto No. 1. Additional concerto engagements included performances with the Houston Symphony Orchestra, New Jersey Symphony, Albany Symphony, San Marino Republic Orchestra, Orchestre Haydn (Italy), Hannover Hochschulorchester (Germany), and Symphonic Orchestra of Castilla y León (Spain) working with conductors Peter Oundjian, Eiji Oue, Arthur Hagen, Krzysztof Urbanski, and Alastair Willis.
